#### **IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME NEWS**

#### Introducing Information Technology in Global Society

With our student strength in Grades 11 & 12 increasing (86 in Grade 11 and 79 in Grade 12) we have been able to further extend our already considerable subject offering. This year we have added 'Information Technology in a Global Society' (ITGS).

15 students have currently opted for ITGS and will learn about the place which IT holds in our rapidly changing world. ITGS is not a course on IT itself, but is a Humanities course that examines the effects and influences which Information Technology exert upon contemporary society.

#### **Introducing Telugu Language**

We are also introducing Telugu Language A into our subjects offering for Grade 11 this year. As literature is a significant component of the course, the level of students' Telugu must be to a very good standard.

The Academy is the only school in Hyderabad to offer the prestigious bilingual IB diploma (with students taking not one but TWO First Language subjects. This is achieved by those students taking Hindi Language A). We will also be the first school in our region to graduate students with Telugu Language A in the Bilingual Diploma.

#### Service Based Learning (SBL) summer internships

Congratulations to those students who served their summer internship over the vacation period. This is a particularly demanding task but immensely rewarding. DP1 intern students' achievements were celebrated at a special assembly on August 20th at The Academy.

#### **IB MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAMME NEWS**

#### **Language Support**

Bangla Language Support, initiated last year will be continued as will Dari Language Support. This year we will also deliver Russian Language instruction for Grade 8 students and will be offering an option for Telugu (in place of Hindi) for Grade 7 students. We plan to extend Telugu instruction in the Senior School over the next few years, subject to demand.

#### **Creative Arts expansion**

Another area of planned growth for this academic year is the Creative Arts area, particularly in Music. We have purchased a number of different instruments for students to try, both for enjoyment and a sense of achievement. All students have been learning to play the keyboard and tabla, and last year several students began learning guitar.

We hope to have a Concert Band and a Jazz Band (and maybe even run a Rock Band Competition annually!) Moving forward, we encourage students to try out different instruments and practise with these. We look forward to building on foundations laid in previous years for choral and instrumental events.

#### A FINAL NOTE ON LEADERSHIP AND STEWARDSHIP

Leadership and Stewardship (including Community Service) are central platforms of our educational philosophy. This year, significant challenges will be presented to students, encouraging them to extend themselves and develop important skills and attitudes regarding community spirit and citizenship, empathy and perseverance.

The opportunities offered here in Hyderabad are indeed wide and deep. Like all IBO World Schools, we emphasise a holistic approach to education, aiming to develop mind and body and spirit. As an Aga Khan Academy, we take this further still - leadership and stewardship are added to the ten IB Learner Profile attributes.
