
**TOP MUSIC AWARDS


The Aga Khan Academy, Mombasa presented 65 MYP Candidates each of whom has qualified for the IB MYP Certificate. The school is on a growth trend since the first MYP cohort had their grades validated in 2011. The number grew from 41 in 2012 to 65; an increase of 37%.

Of the 65 students, over 67% have chosen to do the Diploma at the Academy.



The school had a mean grade of 5.35 out of a possible maximum of 7 which was well above the world average as shown in the graph below. This was a big leap compared to 2011 when it recorded 4.55.

Personal Project Results



We had 11% of the students get a mean grade of 6.00 and above while the rest had a mean grade above the satisfactory 4.00.

One of the key highlights in the performance this year was in the Personal Project which is a precursor to the Extended Essay in the Diploma. The percentage of those who achieved grade 6 and above was 69%; with 28 of the students achieving Grade 7.

The Personal Project topics were as varied as there were students. Karishma Bhagani invented a Water Purifier for use by a community in Kongowea while Maxwin refurbished and stocked a students' library in his former school at Maweni Primary School among others.

In the MYP, students take a range of subjects in varied subject groups. These include Languages, Humanities, Science, Mathematics, Arts, PE and Technology. The students then graduate to the Diploma Programme where they continue with these courses in varied combinations.
