### Student Life

#### **Enrichment Activities**

#### House Activities

The mathematics department organised a week of math related activities that culminated in the final House Math Competition. Students from each House demonstrated high aptitude in the related problems. The next House events include Swimming and the Lip Sync Competition.

#### Leadership

We continue to see students take leadership in organising different community and service activities. Different initiatives have been put in place by the SRC, House Captains, tuck-shop team, and CAS groups, all aimed at enriching the experiences of the students and the community at large. We continue to provide opportunities to the students for growth in this area.

Several students from the residences were among the team that travelled to Nairobi for the Expressive Arts Department academic trip. Feedback from the students shows that a lot was learnt. The places they visited included theatres, art galleries, and Kenyatta University Fine Arts Department among many other places.

This weekend, we have about 45 students travelling to Nairobi for a basketball tournament. We wish them safety and success in the competition. In addition, some Hindu students have organised the Garba Night to share some of their cultural celebrations. We wish the Hindu students attending the Diwali festivals, a good time and Happy Diwali to the entire Hindu community.

The events in the coming weeks include, Zawadi Bazaar, Suso sport event and residential cultural night.

## Diploma Programme

DP2s are running the race of their lives right now. Their university applications are being processed and submitted, early decision applications have been uploaded in Naviance along with their personal statements, supplements, recommendation letters and evaluation forms. University representatives, such as those we hosted from the University of British Columbia (UBC) last week, have been visiting and interacting with the students. Incredibly, university acceptance offers have already started pouring in.

Their Extended Essay final drafts are in, and IAs in various subjects have also come in. The last leg of weekly cycle tests are now on, but beginning to wind down – so that the focus can shift to preparation for their Pre-Mock exams in January. So as they say, right now the heat is really on.

The DP1s have settled into their subjects, and are now beginning to experience the depth and scope of their chosen premises in earnest. They had a formal initiation to the Extended Essay towards the end of October. They too are receiving exposure to university processes through sessions with the University Counselling team, and through interactions with university representatives in fairs and visits. The last SAT exams were held in the last week of October, in which some of them participated. They have been given an immersive induction into their CAS Projects and portfolio generation and are also gearing up for the DP1 play, with auditions underway. They are also gearing up for the November exams that will assess their immersion and growth in the Diploma Programme tangibly and holistically for the first time.

Together, the DP2s and DP1s watched a performance of 'Death and the Maiden' at the Little Theater Club on 30 October, as an extension of their curriculum since they are all doing the play in their course.

# Middle Years Programme

The main focus right now is the Year 10 Mock Personal Project Exhibition which is going on today. For the first time, the Year 10s are sharing what they have been working on for the last eight months with other students and teachers. This is a significant part of the PP journey which gives them valuable feedback as they prepare to write and submit their first draft report. We hope they will have a good learning experience, and appreciate the support of their parents in this process.



### Staff Update

The Head librarian, Mr. Apollo Abung'u left the school at the end of October after being with us for four months due to family reasons which the school understood and accepted to release him. We are in the process of interviewing and identifying his replacement. The operations of the Senior School Library are going on well under our two librarians, Ms. Joyce Wangari and Ms. Phylis Nyariki
