Summer Service Internships - positive contributions in a changing world



60 Senior School grade 11 students spent the first week of their summer holidays in Anantapur at a special orientation camp to launch their unique four-week service internships. Students spent an intensive month in urban and rural areas of eight Indian states (Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Orissa, Rajasthan and Himachal Pradesh), working with over 20 non-profit organisations focusing on education, rural development, women and child empowerment, disaster awareness, youth training, agriculture and nutrition. Several of these organisations are agencies belonging to AKDN, the Aga Khan Development Network.


Students had a feedback session last week, and they will be presenting their experiences and receiving certificates on 19th August, our first Saturday School for 2017-
